

Why Cooperation between Cities and Universities matters









- Located between Rotterdam and The Hague
- > 101,000 inhabitants
- Seat of Delft University of Technology, Dutch Institute of Applied Sciences, Deltares Water and Delta Institute, IKEA Concept Center, UNESCO-IHE
- > 700 knowledge based companies, 16,000 employees
- > 22,000 students, 17% international students
- ➤ 42% population has higher education degree









- > Polycentric, functional urban area
- > 2,2 million inhabitants (2,250 per km²)
- > 23 municipalities
- ➤ Total Regional GDP: € 170 billion / Regional GDP per inhabitant: € 36,500
- > 55,000 students (of which 12,000 foreign) / 80,000 expats
- > 1,750 foreign companies







- ➤ Strategic Regional Investment Agenda: 29 projects, € 9 billion
- > Focus on economic development, transport and mobility
- Next economy: Fieldlabs new manufacturing, Robotisation,
 3D printing, Biobased economy
- > Campus development universities: Delft + Leiden
- New regional sustainable energy grid
- Sustainable transport

EUniverCities – Philosophy – I

University cities are key engines of Europe's Horizon2020 strategy, and the prime loci of smart growth

They are **powerhouses** for the development of new knowledge, ideas, products and services that are at the basis of prosperity and well-being.

University cities are **incubators**, attracting and educating talented young people. They are breeding nests for entrepreneurship, and attract knowledge-based companies.

Importance attributed to **technology and innovation**: most universities are predominantly technology oriented





EUniverCities – Philosophy – II

University cities face specific challenges and problems:

- ➤ Housing and other facilities for students, researchers, university staff
- ➤ Internationalization: competition for talent, cross-border research and cooperation
- Regional cooperation and creation of metropolitan areas
- > Economic development





EUniverCities – Philosophy – III

EUniverCities addresses the issue how to improve **city-university collaboration**

Unique features:

- Cities and Universities participate as tandems
- > We make use of Peer Review Methodology
- Meetings in alternating cities
- Project cooperation (sub themes)
- Policy influence at European level





Integrated Approach


Currently, city-university collaboration is often very **compartmented**, fragmented, or ad-hoc, organized along the lines of the municipal organization, around specific themes, or driven by individuals.

EUniverCities therefore aims to:

- bring policy domains together at the local level, develop more integrated approaches
- ➤ involve relevant stakeholders effectively in the policymaking process
